

Auditors' Report

To the Members of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Nova Scotia

We have audited the financial statements of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Nova Scotia as at December 31, 2008 in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards and expressed an unqualified opinion on these financial statements in our report dated January 23, 2009. In our opinion, the information contained in the attached condensed statement of operations and the statement of changes in net assets is consistent with the above mentioned financial statements from which it was derived.

To obtain a better understanding of the organization's financial position and the results of its operations for the year ended December 31, 2009, this condensed financial statement should be read in light of the audited financial statements.

Notes To Financial Statements For The Year Ended December 31, 2009

1. PURPOSE OF ORGANIZATION

The College of Physicians and Surgeons of Nova Scotia is a not-for-profit organization that serves as a licensing and regulatory body for the medical profession within the province of Nova Scotia.

2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Capital Asset

Capital assets are stated at cost. Amortization is provided by the diminishing balance method at the following annual rates:

Furniture and equipment	20%
Computer hardware and software	30%

Leaseholds are being amortized by the straight-line method over a period of 15 years. This period is the term of the lease plus one renewal period. Equipment under capital lease is being amortized by the straight-line method over a period of 66 months. This period is approximately the term of the lease.

Investments

The short-term investments are classified as a financial asset held for trading and are recognized and measured at their fair value. Cost and fair market value were approximately the same amount at the end of the year.

The long-term investments are comprised of fixed income securities, equities and units of a T-Bill fund. The fixed income securities are classified as an investment held-to-maturity and are recognized and measured at amortized cost. The investment in the equities and T-Bill fund are classified as financial assets held for trading and are recognized and measured at their fair value.

Development Costs

Development costs represent costs incurred by the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Nova Scotia to develop an appraisal centre for the licensing of international medical graduates. These costs are amortized against future revenues.

Deferred Revenue

Physicians are licensed on a calendar year basis. Annual fees billed by the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Nova Scotia before December 31 and related to the subsequent year, are recorded as deferred revenue.

Revenue Recognition

Annual licensing fees and professional corporation fees are recorded as revenue in the year to which they relate. Revenue from other fees and programs is recognized as the service is rendered. Investment income is recognized on the accrual basis. Recoveries of hearing expenses are recorded when received. Government funding is recorded as revenue in the year to which it relates.

Deferred Lease Inducement

The lease inducement is being amortized by the straight-line method over the term of the lease.

Net Assets

Effective 1996, the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Nova Scotia began following a policy of appropriating surplus for future commitments.

Surplus is now allocated based on expected future use as follows:

Hearing Committee Decision / Consensual Reprimand Summary

Issued between June 1, 2009 and May 31, 2010

In accordance with section 81 (1) of the Nova Scotia *Medical Act*, the College publishes the following summaries in each year's annual report. Hearing Committee Decision
June 19, 2009: Dr. Thomas Crawford, Glace Bay, Nova Scotia

On June 18, 2009, the Hearing Committee of the College accepted a settlement agreement advanced by the College and Dr. Thomas Crawford. The facts agreed to by Dr. Crawford included having acquired prescription medications without a medical prescription; inappropriately completing blank triplicate prescriptions to access narcotics for his own use; self-administering controlled substances or narcotics without a proper prescription; and breaching conditions and restrictions contained in earlier agreements with the College. The disposition specified that Dr. Crawford be reprimanded and that his licence to practice medicine be suspended until he complied with all requirements of the Settlement Agreement.

Dr. Crawford agreed that a removal of his license suspension would be considered by the College following four months of satisfactory independent reports on his health and addiction status. He also agreed that if the suspension were lifted, his licence would be reinstated subject to certain restrictions. Dr. Crawford agreed to pay \$15,000.00 toward the total costs incurred by the College in the conclusion of the case. On December 23, 2009, the College suspended Dr. Crawford's license once again until further notice.
